

The Clay-Rhynes Eye Clinic is a high volume medical/surgical practice in our 8000 square foot state-of-the-art clinic, where the resident will perform YAG capsulotomies, iridotomies, and vitreolysis, along with



will also manage a large number of pediatric patients. At RGB Eye Associates the resident will see pre-op work-ups on cataract, lid, and corneal surgeries, observe surgeries
