Following a career in private practice, he is now Associate Professor and Chief of Low Vision Services at NSU Oklahoma College of Optometry. In 2014, as Director of the Lesley L. Walls Vision Center, he was able to expand Low Vision services in the Broken Arrow area.

Dr. Lewerenz is a Diplomate in Low Vision in the American Academy of Optometry. Professional positions include Chair of the Low Vision Section of the American Academy of Optometry and Chair Elect of the Vision Rehabilitation Section of the American Optometric Association.

### LOW VISION AND REHABILITATION SERVICES


This state-of-the-art clinic is equipped for a complete evaluation of vision function. Scanning laser microperimetry allows detailed analysis of central dim or blind spots and fixation patterns. An outstanding selection of optical and electronic devices will be available to help patients realize their goals.

impaired, a full spectrum of services is available, including orientation and mobility, occupational therapy and assistive technology.
