Curriculum

Curriculum: The educational objectives, learning activities, and expected outcomes of the Residency in Vision Rehabilitation include:

- Through assisting with the Vision Rehabilitation course and working with attending faculty, the resident will become very proficient in providing an efficient yet thorough vision rehabilitation evaluation, and will also become proficient in evaluating and prescribing strategies that will meet the patient's goals.
- 2. Provision of optometric care to a large number and diversity of patients at the WVC and the NSUOCO campus and hospital clinics.
- 3. Appropriate referral and co-management of patients with physicians and other health care disciplines. External rotations may be arranged to enhance expertise other areas of interest.
- 4. Clinical supervision and education of optometry students at the WVC and at NSUOCO.
- 5. Provide lecture and workshop presentations in the form of continuing education, grand rounds, optometry classroom, etc.
- 6. Participation in residency seminar activities, including literature review, journal club, and grand rounds.
- 7. Require attendance of continuing education courses to satisfy Oklahoma licensure requirements at a minimum.
- 8. Completion of a research paper, literature review, or case report of publishable quality.
- 9. Active involvement in the optometric community through membership and participation in optometric organizations

The typical weekly schedule of the resident demonstrates the amount of time dedicated to clinical and didactic/scholarly activities that allows for the fulfillment of the curriculum goals. The activities are then tracked in the resident's patient log and the resident's activity log.
